



- 68% of travel is driven by arts & culture.




#### ARTS & CULTURE ARE ECONOMIC DRIVERS



# BEN REIFEL: SOUTH DAKOTA ARTS HERO


Ben Reifel was born in a log cabin on the Rosebud Reservation in 1906 and became the first (and only) Native American to win statewide office in South Dakota. In 1968 Reifel gave a moving speech to Congress asking for support to create the National Endowment for the Humanities

and National Arts Council. He quoted Ralph Waldo Emerson and President Dwight Eisenhower to make his points, but the most influential part of his speech was what the arts meant to

him as a youth

"I shall never forget the impact a book made on me when I was a child. I have a feeling that it changed my whole life. Books cannot be eaten. They cannot be changed into guns and butter. But they can — they can and they have — changed the whole course of human events."

Reifel was referencing Giants of the Republic by Edward Ever-



humanities." Reifel's heartfelt testimony was instrumental to the bill passing and to the creation of the endowment for the arts and humanities. When we see how the arts flourish in our nation and state, we can thank Reifel and perhaps his ranching neighbor who loaned him








#### **GET YOUR PASS**


A mobile-exclusive passport of curated attractions, retailers, restaurants, parks and more.

ACROSS EACH FOUR REGIONS












